

Lock It! Hide It! Keep It!

THEFTS FROM UNLOCKED CARS

You are more likely to be a victim of a vehicle crime than any other crime reported to the Attleboro Police Department. A car thief can gain access to your car in virtually seconds. In less than 30 seconds a thief could steal the valuables inside your car.

REDUCE YOUR RISK

ALWAYS LOCK YOUR CAR

Remove the keys, roll up the windows and lock car doors.

Take all valuables with you when you park. Make sure all items, regardless of value, are not visible.

If possible, store your car in a closed and locked garage.

If your car is stored near your house, leave your exterior lights on throughout the night. Consider replacing the light fixture closest to your car with a motion detector unit. Motion detectors are a good psychological deterrent since the normal assumption of a person seeing a light come on is that someone has observed them.

If you park on the street or in a parking lot, choose a well-lit, open space.

SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

Report suspicious activity

Report any person in the area who appear suspicious to you. Please report people walking around your neighborhood in the middle of the night. If you see something, say something.

Also, report any unauthorized entry into your car regardless if anything was taken. The Police Department relies on the partnership with the citizens of Attleboro to be effective in reducing crime.
